



4TH AVENUE WELL PROJECT CONSTRUCTION NOTICE - 02/01/2020

Happy to report the project is still on schedule and budget.

Here is what to expect over the next couple of weeks:

Test Pumping: Thank you all for your patience and understanding during the well test pumping. Unfortunately, the contractor's initial pump engine failed but they were able to quickly replace the motor and generator on site and continued with the 24-hour pump test. SLCDPU is very pleased with the results and how the well is performing. The well continues to be a great producing well and the relining of it and other work did not impact the productivity of the well. The equipment from this work has been removed from the site.

Tree Removal: The three trees on the project site that were approved for removal, have been removed. The tree material has been donated to the Memory Grove Foundation and the Foundation is identifying ways in which it can be repurposed. Construction Work: Equipment has been brought to the site so the construction team can begin removing the underground vault. This equipment includes a large excavator, dump truck, dumpster, and other smaller equipment. To remove the vault more easily, it will be sawed into pieces. Once the vault is removed, backfill will be placed and compacted. As you can imagine, this demolition and construction work will be a little noisy but will stay within the approved sound levels and the work will be performed during normal work hours.

Power Work: The contractor, VanCon, has installed two temporary power poles and has run an electrical line over Canyon Road to the site. One temporary pole is next to the current light pole and the other one is on the well site.

Traffic Control: Our team continues to assess and monitor traffic in the area and the traffic control elements that we have in place. Our team has continued to see various other construction equipment in the area that are not part of this project. We will try to keep you updated on what we know about this.

Workdays & Hours: We will be returning to our regular workdays and times – Monday through Friday from 8 am to 5 pm. We will let you know if we anticipate anything different.

About the Project

Salt Lake City Department of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) is upgrading the 4th Avenue well to meet current safety and environmental requirements to ensure it continues to provide clean and reliable drinking water. The well has been at severe risk of failure as the electrical system is outdated and the well head and electrical components are located in a subsurface vault. This does not meet current drinking water regulations or electrical codes and is an unsafe working environment for workers.
